##### **Cats - Our Curious and Fluffy Pets**

Cats are small animals with four legs, a tail and soft fur and people often keep them as pets.

Counting more than half a billion individuals and over 70 different breeds, cats are the world's most popular pets. Even though they are curious animals who like to explore and hunt, cats are also a truly social species.

Cats have an impressive "family." Lions, tigers, cheetahs and many others are his biological cousins. They are usually very skilled hunters with flexible, muscular bodies and highly developed senses.

Their night vision is especially good. The ears are large, and very sensitive to high-frequency sounds. Cats' whiskers are not just for show. They serve to help cats move in the dark and detect objects. They also possess a highly developed sense of smell, and a very useful sharp set of teeth!

Cats are able to land on their feet after a fall. This is a beautiful ability which combines both vision and a sense of balance. While this is hard to notice in a closed environment, cats can actually run up to 30 miles per hour. They can also jump seven times their height.

They can be a graceful companion. Humans and cats have lived together for thousands of years, from the ancient Egyptians up to this day and age. They communicate with humans through mewing, purring or sometimes grunting to show their needs and wishes.

Cats like to sleep! Actually, they sleep more than most animals – usually 12-16 hours a day. They also like to play. Now, this is especially true for kittens (young cats). By the way, kittens are usually born after about 66 days of pregnancy, three to five kittens in a single birth.

Although there is a common perception that cats love milk, most of them are lactose intolerant and should not drink cow's milk. They also like touching each other noses which in cat language means greeting, like when humans shake hands.

### **Pregunta 1**

### **Pregunta 2**

### **Pregunta 5**
